

DeLeo to Give Gaming Details at Legislative Tuncheon

Friday, April 9, 12:15 pm, East Campus Commons, Bridgewater State College

The 2010 Legislative Luncheon is scheduled for Friday, April 9 at 12:15 pm. The event will be held at the East Campus Commons at Bridgewater State College. The Featured Speaker will be Speaker of the House Robert A. DeLeo.

State Representative Robert A. DeLeo (D-Winthrop) has represented the 19th Suffolk District in the Massachusetts House of Representatives since 1991. Representative DeLeo holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Northeastern University and a Juris Doctor from Suffolk University Law School.

Rep. DeLeo became Speaker of the Massachusetts House of Representatives in 2009. He vowed to target House rules, ethics, transportation and pension reform. Within 100 days of assuming the Speakership, the House passed sweeping reforms in each of those areas. His efforts have won him the praise of The Boston Globe, which reported "DeLeo showed political courage" in seeking fiscal solutions to the economic crisis. He has also been called, in the pages of The Globe, "an expert on the state budget."

Prior to becoming Speaker, Rep. DeLeo served as the chairman of the House Committee on Ways and Means. Before that, he chaired the House

Committee on Bills in the Third Reading; served as the House chair for the Joint Committee on Local Affairs; and chaired the House Committee on Ethics.

DeLeo has remained committed to his constituents. He served as chairman and was a founding member of M.W.R.A. Legislative Caucus; Legislative Caucus on Air Transportation; and was a founding member of the Legislative Caucus on Older Citizens' Concerns. Prior to his tenure on Beacon Hill, Representative DeLeo served on the Town of Winthrop's Board of

Selectmen-during which time he served as Board Chairman for a total of nine years.




2010 Business Expo to feature over 30 table top booths




Hulit has a B.A. from American University in International Studies, an MBA from Boston University, and recently completed the Advanced Leadership Development Program at Babson College.

April is Dig Safe Month

Nearly one-fourth of the United States relies on clean, convenient and safe natural gas for its energy needs through an infrastructure of more than 2.2 million miles of pipelines and mains. Bay State Gas works closely with industry, government agencies and emergency services to

ensure the highest levels of

service, security and safety.

At the beginning of this spring construction season, Bay State Gas reminds all contractors and homeowners that prior to the start of any excavation project on public or private property, you must call Dig Safe to have the location of all underground utility pipes and cables marked. Projects include, planting trees and shrubs, landscaping, rebuilding walls and driveways, installing swimming pools, building additions to homes, and installing sewer lines, septic systems and drains.

In Massachusetts, the Dig Safe Law requires that Dig Safe be notified at 1 - 888 - DIG - SAFE, or 811, at least 3



business days (72-hours) before starting an excavation project. There are substantial fines for violation of the Dig Safe Law.

Dig Safe is a "one-call center" that will notify all natural gas, electric, telephone and cable companies with underground pipes and cables in the area of the project. The utilities will

then visit the site and mark the location of their facilities. Dig Safe is a free service, funded entirely by its member utility companies.

If you expect a gas leak, move to a safe area, do not smoke or operate electrical switches or appliances, and call 911 and Bay State Gas at 1-800-525-8200 immediately with the exact location. Gas leaks are recognized by a distinctive odor similar to rotten eggs, a white cloud, bubbles in standing water, blowing dust, dead vegetation or an unusual hissing sound.




