Chamber Advocates for Rail Service



The Metro South Chamber of

Commerce is advocating for continued commuter rail service along the Old Colony Rail Line serving Brockton and the Metro South Region. The advocacy comes on the heels of the MBTA announcing possible service cuts communities including Brockton and Bridgewater. "Commuter rail service has transformed entire neighborhoods along the rail and especially in the City of Brockton," said Chamber President and CEO, Christopher Cooney. The MBTA is facing a projected budget deficit in 2013. The commuter rail transportation system is an essential asset that contributes greatly to the economic well-being of the region. Eliminating portions of the transit service will compound the negative effects currently being felt on the economy within region. The Chamber strongly urges the MBTA, MassDot and the Commonwealth to continue commuter rail operations funding and its current schedule, to support sustainable means of funding mass transit, and to encourage the use of transit tax credits as a means to reduce the deficit. "Commuter rail has permanently connected the Metro South region to Boston, the hub of New England. We would like to see this link strengthened through better, more reliable ontime service. Further, we would like to see an increased number of scheduled trains providing greater use and value to this region," said Chamber President CEO, Christopher Cooney. "This proposal to cut rail service is a proposal to derail progress," he went on to say.



In response to Lieutenant Governor Tim Murray's "WOW Initiative" to promote STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) education across Massachusetts, the Metro South Connecting Activities Partnership, a collaboration of the Brockton Area Workforce Investment Board and the Metro South Chamber of Commerce, held the 1st Annual STEM Career Exploration Event at Bridgewater State University on March 7th, 2012. The goal of this event, which was sponsored by the Office of

Regional Outreach at Bridgewater State University, was to expose youth to a variety of STEM Careers in a fast paced, "speed networking" style setting.

In ten minute segments, eighty-five local high school students from the Metro South region shifted from table to table to discuss career options with professionals from various STEM fields, such as video game development, forensics, engineering and health services. Several volunteer BSU students also spoke with youth about college life and coursework. "The goal was to motivate youth to start thinking about the future. We wanted to expose them to the broad range of career opportunities available in STEM," said Kathleen Lynch, the coordinator of this event.

"What was magic about the STEM Career Exploration event was that it opened a window of awareness that could lead many students toward careers in STEM," said Wini Dillon, a science teacher at Stoughton High School.

Dr. Arthur Goldstein, Dean, BSU's College of Science and Mathematics, delivered a dynamic keynote which focused on STEM research needed across the globe, such as earthquake prediction, sustainable energy, disease research, and space exploration. Cheer Pack Moves to West Bridgewater, Adds Jobs

Rod Jané of New England Expansion Strategies (NEES) recently helped Cheer Pack North CHEER PACK America receive unanimous West Bridgewater Town Meeting approval of a Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Agreement for its manufacturing relocation and expansion project.

Cheer Pack is relocating from Plymouth, MA to a new manufacturing and headquarters facility at One United Drive in West Bridgewater to accommodate a major expansion. The company manufactures innovative packaging for the food and beverage industry. The project will result in the retention of 35 full-time jobs and the creation of 77 new full-time jobs. Cheer Pack will invest approximately \$23 million and lease 187,500





square feet of the 315,000 industrial building that formerly housed the United Liquors headquarters and distribution center. building has been approximately 83% vacant for the last nine years and is coming out of foreclosure. The project is eligible for the Abandoned Building Tax Deduction. In

addition to managing the tax incentives for the project, NEES has also coordinated all local permitting activities and has helped Cheer Pack obtain three permits, a Special Permit (for change in use to manufacturing in a Water Resource Protection District), a Site Plan Review, and Building Permit. All three permits were obtained in 48 days. The process was assisted by the Metro South Regional Economic Development Organization (REDO).
