

At a special press conference held on July 1, 2015, it was announced by Mayor Bill Carpenter and the Cape Cod RTA, along with Lt. Governor Karyn Polito, that the CapeFLYER's weekend train service will now include a stop in Brockton! From Memorial Day to Labor Day, the service will operate on Friday evenings and throughout the weekend, from South Station to Hyannis.

# Chamber Mourns Loss of Senator Kennedy

The Metro South Chamber of Commerce mourns the loss of Brockton native and beloved Senator Thomas Kennedy.

Kennedy was first elected to the House in 1982 and took his seat in the Senate in 2009. He won his most recent election in 2014 with 66 percent of the vote. Kennedy was chairman of the Joint Committee on Election Laws and vice chairman of the Joint Committee on Veterans and Federal Affairs, among other committee assignments. Senator Kennedy served many towns of the Metro South region including Brockton, Halifax, Hanover, Hanson, Whitman, and parts of East Bridgewater and Easton.

"The Senator was a scholar and a gentleman," says Chamber President Christopher Cooney. "I left every meeting with him knowing more and feeling better, no matter what subject. I enjoyed the many opportunities to work together for the benefit of Brockton and beyond. I will miss him and his tireless advocacy on behalf of the region."

#### Good Samaritan Earns Straight A's for Safety

Good Samaritan Medical Center has been recognized for its dedication to patient safety with an A grade in the Spring 2015 Hospital Safety Score, which rates how well hospitals protect patients from preventable medical errors, injuries and infections within the hospital. 
### Thomas Edison Power Plant Renovated and Reopened in Brockton



In 1883, the Metro South Chamber headquarters, the Brockton Edison Electric Illuminating Power Station, was owned by Thomas Edison and the Brockton Edison Electric Illuminating Company – better known today as National Grid.

It was here, in the Chamber building, that Thomas Edison first perfected the "Standardized Underground Village Utility," through a three-wire underground

power distribution system. In its first couple of years, the steam-powered Edison Power Station served 109 residential, commercial and industrial customers, including the very first American theatre and American Fire station to receive central generated power. This invention was then quickly replicated in over 5,000 cities across America.



Thomas Edison was able to accomplish "his first showcase" system in Brockton after years of research,

consultation, and education. It was in Brockton that he found the business support and advocacy required to allow his concepts to become a reality.

As Thomas Edison's son, Charles, was later quoted as saying... "Father often proudly said he completed his first perfect model right here in Brockton...He always cherished the close friendships and mementoes associated with his work here".

In 1988, the Chamber purchased and renovated the building to provide office space and a center to house research, consultation, education, and advocacy, complete with the spirit of innovation inspired by Thomas Edison. With this year's revitalization of the building, made possible through our Centennial Innovation Campaign partners, we have been able to provide necessary structural and cosmetic updates. Upgrades include a new roof, new skylights, new carpeting, fresh paint, new awnings, signage, furniture and technology.

With the assistance of our generous sponsors, the Metro South Chamber is happy to provide a first class center where businesses can develop their ideas and grow their assets via the Edison Business Incubator - a location where businesses can gain the knowledge to thrive through professional business counseling provided by SCORE, the Brockton 21st Century Corporation, the Brockton Redevelopment Authority, or the Supplier Diversity Office. It is a place where individuals can realize their entrepreneurial dreams through resources made available in the Business Assistance Center. And finally, it is a place where community members and visitors alike can receive regional information on local attractions, events, and businesses.

In the words of Edison, "There are no rules here, we're just trying to accomplish something". Together, under the leadership of our Board of Directors and the Chamber Staff, we are accomplishing something. We hope many aspiring business people will use these resources to accomplish something as well!


### "Careers in Health" Initiative Celebrates Success!






