#### Employment/Staying Power.

The Small Business of the Year nominee must have been in business for a minimum of three consecutive years under the current ownership, and have fewer than 50 full-time equivalent employees. The Entrepreneur of the Year nominee must have been in business less than three years. and have fewer than 10 full-time equivalent employees.

#### Growth.

The nominee should demonstrate growth in employees, revenues, and profitability.

#### Innovation.

The firm should demonstrate creativity and imagination in the development of its business or in its product or service

#### Social Responsibility.

Nominees should reflect internal and external social responsibility, which may include one or more of the following points: strong, comprehensive employee relations programs; efforts by the company and its staff to aid or benefit the community through personal involvement and/or donations of company resources; efforts to encourage diversity in its workforce and management; activity in the business community through involvement in industry or professional organizations; and development of other programs relating to social and community betterment.

Winners will be selected by the Chamber's Award Selection Committee and will be announced at a special awards program in May. Healey currently chairs several special commissions for the Governor focused

reform, sexual and domestic violence, homelessness and the maritime economy. She also presides over the Governor's Council, the body responsible for confirming the Governor's judicial appointments.

From 1987 to 1997, Healey enjoyed a distinguished career as a law and public safety consultant at Abt Associates, Inc., in Cambridge, MA. While at Abt, she conducted extensive research for the U.S. Department of Justice related to child abuse and neglect, domestic violence, gang violence, victim and witness intimidation and the prosecution of drug crimes. Healey's findings led her to author four books and numerous articles focused on improving standards and practices throughout the criminal justice system.

Prior to her election, Healey was Chairman of the Massachusetts Republican Party and is credited with successfully re-energizing and expanding the party's grassroots base, laying the foundation for the party's current record setting fundraising effort.

Healey graduated from Harvard College in 1982 and received a bachelor's degree in government. She was awarded a



## Re-dedication of Civil War Soldier

On November 12, 1907 the Fletcher Women's Relief Corps presented a 29-foot granite statue of a Civil War soldier to the City of Brockton. The statue, given in memory of those who served in the Federal Army and Navy, inscribed "We Honor Their Nobel Deeds" stands in Perkins Park on North Main Street.

A falling tree limb damaged the statue breaking off his left hand, the top of his rifle, and part of his cap. It had remained in this condition for over fifty years.

Through grants and efforts of the Metro South Chamber of Commerce and the Military Historical Society of Massachusetts restoration was made in the fall of 2005 through Rika Smith McNally & Associates of Framingham.

On April 21, 2006 at 11:00 a.m. the Chamber will host a rededication of the Civil War Soldier

memorial at Perkins Park on North Main Street in Brockton.

## **Building Here, Assembling There**

## South Shore Residents Building Homes for Katrina Hurricane Victims

This month, members of several South Shore churches are joining forces to build frames for houses for victims of Hurricane Katrina who are still homeless six months after the disaster. Completed frames for five houses will be trucked to Gulfport, Mississippi, one of the hardest hit areas, where they will be assembled on new concrete slabs.

'Operation Rebound,' as the project is called, is a partnership of area churches, builders and building material suppliers. The idea evolved when several South Shore residents flew to Gulfport shortly after the hurricane to assess the needs; then returned determined to help.

Mark Lundquist of Whitman, owner of Fortress Builders, visited Gulfport twice after the hurricane hit. He says, "The need is so huge it will take them 10-12 years to recover. Progress is slow, but the victims are still in need." Lundquist isn't new to volunteer construction projects. In the past, he helped put a new roof on a church in Brazil, and built houses in Mexico.

Another organizer, Coast Guard Captain Bob Durfey of Marshfield, says the group has enough volunteers – about 100 people, including 30 carpenters and other craftsmen -- but still needs donations of cash, building materials and air miles. Most of the local framing work will be completed on Saturday, February 18.

One hurdle for the group was finding a building large enough for volunteers to simultaneously assemble frames for five 3-bedroom houses. "We knew about the unused structures on the former South Weymouth Naval Air Station," says Durfey. He commends Executive Director Terry Fancher and Facilities Manager Rick Packard of the South Shore Tri-Town Development Corp., the agency overseeing base redevelopment, for allowing the use of the former firehouse on the Base. The project will require about 6,000 square feet indoors plus a large outdoor staging area.

In March, several volunteers will travel to Gulfport to work with members of St. James Baptist Church to help assemble the five 3-bedroom homes on their waiting foundations. The homes are earmarked for single mothers with three or more children who lost everything in the storm.

Churches involved include South Shore Baptist of Hingham, North River Community of Pembroke, and First Baptist of Rockland, among others. Mark Lundquist says among corporate supporters are Cape Cod Lumber of Abington and Sampson Lumber of Pembroke.

Captain Durfey says interested individuals are welcome to come and watch -- and bring monetary or air mile donations. "We need money to buy more materials and air miles to help send a contingent to Gulfport to complete the work on site," he says.

There is an old joke among business owners that says if you own your own business you must keep three sets of books. The first shows figures that indicate your business is more profitable than it really is. This is what you show to a prospective buyer if you decide to sell your business. The second set shows your business to be far less profitable than it truly is. These you use when filing tax returns. The third set is for your own information. These are true figures. Remember, I said this was a joke, only.

Actually, all you need to do, from my point of view, is keep accurate and detailed records of everything related to your business. In essence, the concept is quite simple. Draw a vertical line down the center of the page. On

one side of the line put down all the amounts of money that come into your business and on the other side you list everything that goes out. Add them up and put a plus for profit and a minus for loss. Of course, that's an over simplification. An accountant will tell you what records you must keep and will often give you sound advice on the overall financial picture of your business. And he/she will know how to best handle you tax responsibilities.


