

# The State Office of Minority and Women Business Assistance (SOMWBA)

#### Pre-certification Workshops

The State Office of Minority and Women Business Assistance (SOMWBA) reviews the eligibility of minority and women business enterprises, and minority and female controlled non-profits, to participate in affirmative purchasing and contracting opportunities.

#### What are the workshops?

- Workshops are required for all interested principals of minority and women businesses or nonprofit organizations applying for certifications through SOMWBA.
- •Businesses are at least 51% owned and controlled by minority or female principals, or non-profit that are at least 51% controlled by minority or women board members may be eligible for SOMWBA certification.
- If you need an accommodation for a disability please notify us at

least ten business days in advance.

#### What will the workshops cover?

- Business Affirmative Market programs
- •SOMWBA's certification application
- Explanation of regulatory language and criteria necessary to be certified
- Required documentation for certification
- Explanation of certification process

- The eligible owner/principle of any minority or women business enterprise, or non-profit organization seeking certification
- •All those assisting in the SOMWBA certification process



# **Loan Funds Available for Small Businesses**

The South Eastern Economic Development (SEED) corporation announced today that it has \$500,000 in loans funds available for small businesses in the City of Brockton.

SEED Corporation working in conjunction with the Brockton 21st Century Corporation, the Metro South Chamber of Commerce, and the Old Colony Planning Council established a special loan pool for Brockton businesses with grants from the U.S. Economic Development Administration, and a loan from the U.S. Small Business Administration.

"This pool of funds enables SEED to make loans up to \$50,000 to meet small businesses' needs for equipment, furniture, leasehold improvements, working capital, and paying off high interest credit cards," explained Laurie Walsh, SEED's micro loan and business assistance coordinator.

According to Walsh, SEED can also combine these loans with bank loan or with funds available through other SEED loan programs to meet a business need up to \$100,000. These loans are usually made for five years, but can be amortized over ten years depending on the use of the funds. The interest rate is fixed for the term and ranges from 6% to 7%.

"The goal of this loan pool is to ensure that small businesses in Brockton have the financing they need to grow and create new jobs. Often a small business needs a little more than a bank can provide, or finds that it cannot obtain the funds it needs from a bank, that's when this loan pool comes in," explained Walsh.

According to Walsh, the process for obtaining a loan consist of filling out a fairly simple one sheet application form which can be obtained through SEED's web-site: www.seedcorp.com or by calling SEED at 508.822.1020. For start-up businesses, Walsh suggests attending one of SEED's monthly Business Basics Workshops, and preparing a business plan. A Business Plan Booklet is also available on SEED's website.

Over the past 5 years, SEED has made 33 small loans to businesses in Brockton totaling \$972,000 and helping to create 140 new jobs. These loans have been made to a range of small businesses including restaurants, gift shops, hair salons, fitness centers, day care providers, convenience stores, pharmacies, moving services, manufacturing companies and others.



# **Brockton Lets the Sun Shine in** on Solar Energy Project

The City of Brockton recently unveiled its newest power plant; a 2.4 kilowatt solar power project on the roof of Brockton High School. Brockton Mayor John T. Yunits was joined by representatives from the Brockton School Department, Massachusetts Technology Collaborative (MTC), the US Department of Energy, Evergreen Solar, Inc. and Conservation Services Group (CGS), as well as other city dignitaries, in ceremonies unveiling the system.

The high school project is part of a larger effort, the "Brockton Solar Champions Partnership", which is funded by a US Department of Energy "Millions Solar Roofs" grant. This partnership seeks to put Brockton in the forefront in deploying solar energy through the development of a 1 megawatt solar Brightfield, and the installation of 100 kilowatt of rooftop solar power facilities throughout the city, including the high school.

The high school's science department will use the installation as a "living laboratory" to teach students about solar power, and will integrate a renewable energy curriculum being developed into classroom instruction. The site will also be featured on a MTC website.

The Brockton High School installation features 24 Evergreen Solar panels, which will generate about 3,000 kWh per year of electricity or enough to power the science lab classroom. Installation services and a data acquisition system with weather station were provided by CSG Services, Inc.
