



Brockton Hospital has been recognized by Consumer Reports Magazine for excellence in providing skilled nursing care to local patients. As part of Consumer Reports annual Nursing Home Quality Monitor, the magazine rated nursing facilities across the nation, identifying those that offered the best care. Brockton Hospital's Transitional Care Unit, which provides skilled nursing services to patients transitioning from hospital care back into the community, was listed among the top 10 percent in Massachusetts.

Consumer Reports looked at three areas when judging the best and worst nursing facilities in the nation. Specifically they looked at recent surveys, staffing levels and quality indicators.

29-bed facility located within the
hospital that provides skilled
nursing and rehabilitation services



New Town of "SouthField" Takes Shape

Chamber members tour South Weymouth Naval Base

After 62 years, the former 1,400-acre South Weymouth Naval Air Station just southeast of Boston has a new name and new purpose. Christened SouthField, the project has been named in tribute to the site's historic past as a significant U.S. airfield as well as in celebration of its bright future in the heart of the state's picturesque South Shore.

As the most ambitious and exciting model for live-work-play communities in New England, SouthField was recently lauded by state Environmental Secretary Stephen Pritchard for its innovative Smart Growth concept and its economic benefits to the region. He has issued a certificate enabling SouthField to move

forward on construction of Phase 1A while continuing its environmental review process.

Much will be happening in the next eighteen months. Construction will begin on the first residential village of 500 homes and up to 150,000 square feet of commercial space. SouthField's master plan calls for up to 2,850 homes and 2 million square feet of commercial space by 2017.

In tandem with phase 1A, many transportation improvements in and around the site will be underway. Shea Memorial Boulevard, a main roadway through the site, will be reconstructed. Smaller roads off of Shea, featuring bike and pedestrian paths, will be redeveloped, and complex infrastructure work supporting this phase will also occur. Off site, five intersections on Route 18 in South Weymouth will be widened by the Massachusetts Highway Department.







Women-owned firms increased nearly 20 percent over the latest period studied, according to a report released today by the Office of Advocacy of the U.S. Small Business Administration. During the five years between 1997 and 2002, women-owned firms grew by 19.8 percent while all U.S. firms grew by seven percent.

A wealth of data on women in the work force and women-owned business is presented in Women in Business: A Demographic Review of Women's Business Ownership, written by Office of Advocacy senior economist Dr. Ying Lowrey.

The report uses newly released U.S. Census and other data to

describe women's contributions to The Office of Advocacy, the "small business watchdog" of the government, examines the role and status of small business in the economy and independently represents the views of small business to federal agencies, Congress, and the President. It is the source for small business statistics presented in user-friendly formats and it funds research into small business issues.


