Impacted by Snow? Loans Available



As a result of significantly reduced patronage during recent snow storms, many Massachusetts small businesses have lost sales and fallen behind in meeting their financial obligations, including payroll. This can have a negative impact as it ripples through the local economy, on business owners and employees.

Often, small business financials cannot support traditional bank debt. Solutions available to them include hard money lenders, internet loan programs and credit card debt. All of these sources typically charge high fees and interest rates approaching or even exceeding 20% causing the small business to fall even further behind.

The following proposed loan program from the Massachusetts Growth Capital Corporation (MGCC) is meant to address this pressing need for impacted Massachusetts businesses.

A Proposed Micro Loan fund: MGCC will make available up to \$1,000,000 in loan funds to provide micro-loans of \$5,000 up to \$10,000 to small businesses, targeted to Boston, Gateway Cities, and other communities in need. Anticipate this program to be available for disbursements through May 2015.

The program is targeted to small businesses profitable in the prior year but suffering cash flow problems due to recent loss of revenue. Your business may be eligible to participate in this program.

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Chamber Supports Brockton Destination Resort Casino

In the wake of losing six hundred jobs after entertainment gaming (dog racing) was banned in Massachusetts by referendum a few years ago, The Metro South Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors voted that if entertainment gaming were made legal again in Massachusetts, that this region, the Metro South region, should be given top priority.

"In the interest of fairness to this industry and the hundreds of people who operated entertainment gaming for decades within this region, the Chamber is on record in support of moving this proposal for a destination resort casino facility in Brockton, forward," said Christopher Cooney, Chamber President and CEO.

The Rush Street Gaming proposal features a destination resort gaming facility at the Brockton Fairgrounds on twenty-five acres of land in Brockton. The proposed facility represents a \$650 million dollar investment, including a gaming facility, a 250 room hotel, restaurants, retail, event space and other features to enhance the site and the visitor's experience.

"We will testify before the Brockton City Council in support of this proposed entertainment gaming facility for Brockton and we look forward to the prospect that will allow these lost jobs in gaming to return to the city and the region." concluded Cooney.

Plainridge Park Casino to Open this June

Penn National Gaming began constructing Plainridge Park Casino in March 2014, following the award of the Category 2 Gaming License by the Massachusetts Gaming Commission on February 28, 2014.

Set to open this June, Plainridge Park Casino will include a fully integrated 106,000 square foot racing and gaming facility featuring live harness racing and simulcasting with 1,250 slot machines, an upscale casual dining restaurant, the first-ever Doug Flutie Sports Bar, four-venue food court, harness concourse bar, multi-purpose banquet room, entertainment lounge and casino bar, 1,620 structured and surface parking spaces, 26,000 square foot grandstand with box and reserved seats, and 13,000 square foot clubhouse with box seats.

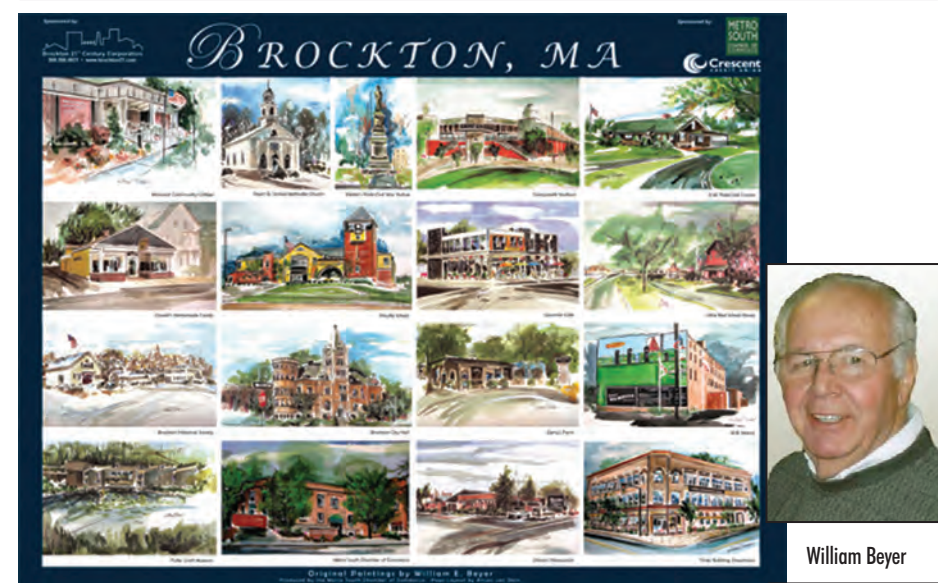
Brockton Rotary's Annual Pancake Breakfast

Brockton Mourns Artist William Beyer

William E. "Bill" Beyer, a renowned New England water colorist, died January 31, 2015 peacefully at the age of 85 after a lengthy illness.

Bill was born and raised in Worcester and graduated from Pratt Institute in New York with a degree in Graphic Design. He served in the U.S. Army during the Korean War as an illustrator of field artillery books. In 1950, he founded the William E. Beyer Associates advertising agency on Newbury Street in Boston, which for 27 years serviced large national companies including John Hancock and Polaroid and local companies such as Weekly Reader, Boston Bruins, and Shopper's World. In the 1980s, his company merged with Dickinson Direct Mail and he later joined Hub Mail as vice president of Advertising.

During this time, Bill fell in love with the fine art of watercolor and began painting. He opened a gallery in Quincy's Marina Bay and built a watercolor business capturing people's memories in portraits of homes, boats, and families.

In addition to the personal memories he created for his gallery clients, Bill's art will live on in his public work. In 1996, he founded the Marina Bay Arts Affair. In addition, Bill created many unique watercolor collage works that celebrated community landmarks and captured the essence of several local cities and towns. His signed and numbered prints raised valuable funds for each community, including "The City of Champions" painting that is still displayed in many buildings throughout Brockton.

The Metro South Chamber of Commerce commissioned William Beyers to paint Brockton scenes for a Brockton map brochure (shown above), hosted an open house and artist signing at Gourmet Cafe. The Chamber continues to proudly display his artwork throughout the Chamber building.

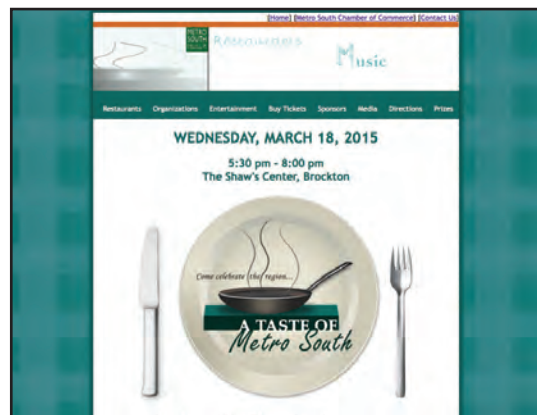

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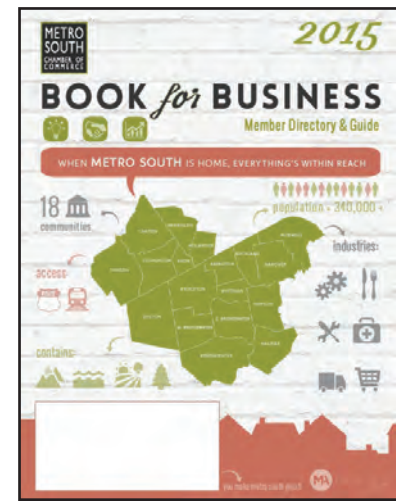

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HR Hotline: Managing Weather Emergencies

Major weather events like what our region has experienced recently raise a diverse set of questions for employers from employee pay to partial or full day closures. Here are some frequently asked questions along with answers.



Q.) *The business will be closed for the entire week because of bad weather. Must exempt employees be paid?*

A.) No. The US Department of Labor DOL regulations state that: "Exempt employees need not be paid for any work week in which they perform no work." However, this is unlikely to apply since most exempt employees will have worked at least Monday and perhaps other days this week.

Q.) *An exempt employee performs work at home when the office was closed because of bad weather. Must the employee be paid?*

A.) Simple answer, yes. The FLSA regulations make it clear that "An exempt employee must receive his or her full salary for any week in which he or she performs work, without regard to the number of days or hours worked. There are exceptions but none of them apply in this case.

Q.) *The office opened today but an exempt employee couldn't make it in because of bad weather. Instead the employee worked at home for a few hours and spent the rest of the day shoveling snow. Pay or no pay?*

A.) Pay. Work at home is also work. Furthermore, anytime an exempt employee misses less than a full day of work because of snow or other adverse weather conditions, his/her salary may not be docked.

Q.) *May an employer require an exempt employee to use vacation or accrued leave for part of the day in this situation?*

A.) Yes according to a DOL Opinion Letter from 2005. This is different from a deduction in that the employee still gets a full day's pay, just from two separate accounts. It may help eliminate some misunderstandings later about an employee's remaining time off if you make it clear to your employees that you are charging their vacation or PTO account. How you handle this issue is more likely to be an employee morale issue than a legal issue given the lateness of your decision.

Q.) *We opened today but an exempt employee couldn't make it in due to bad weather. After spending 90 minutes waiting for a bus, the employee gave up and went home. Pay or no pay?*

A.) Qualified no pay. Commuting is never working time but if the employee did actual work (i.e. more than a de minimis amount of work) while waiting for the bus (e.g. checking emails, making phone calls), the employee is working and must be paid for the day.

Agriculture Grants Available for Small Business

Recently, the federal government announced that rural agricultural producers and small business owners can now apply for resources to purchase and install renewable energy systems or make energy efficiency improvements.

These efforts are aimed at helping farmers, ranchers and other small business owners save money on their energy bills. The resources are made possible by the 2014 Farm Bill. Any agricultural producers with at least 50% of gross income coming from agricultural operations may apply.

USDA is making more than \$280 million available to eligible applicants through the Rural Energy for America Program (REAP). USDA is accepting and reviewing loan and grant applications year-round. Projects eligible for REAP funding include lighting, heating, cooling, ventilation, fans, automated controls and insulation upgrades that reduce energy consumption.

Brockton Downpayment Assistance Program Open



The City of Brockton, Office of Mayor Carpenter, in partnership with NeighborWorks Southern Mass (NWSOMA) and the Brockton Redevelopment Authority (BRA) is offering down payment/closing cost assistance to eligible first time homebuyers purchasing a single or two-family home (no condos) in the City of Brockton. The First Time Homebuyer Program (FTHP) is funded by the U.S Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) HOME Investment Partnership.

The FTHP offers a maximum of \$10,000 financial assistance though a zero-interest deferred loan, repayable in the event of property transfer of ownership or loan refinancing (except for rate and term of the loan). The approval for the amount of funding is based on the amount of assistance needed at the mortgage closing. The funds are subject to availability.

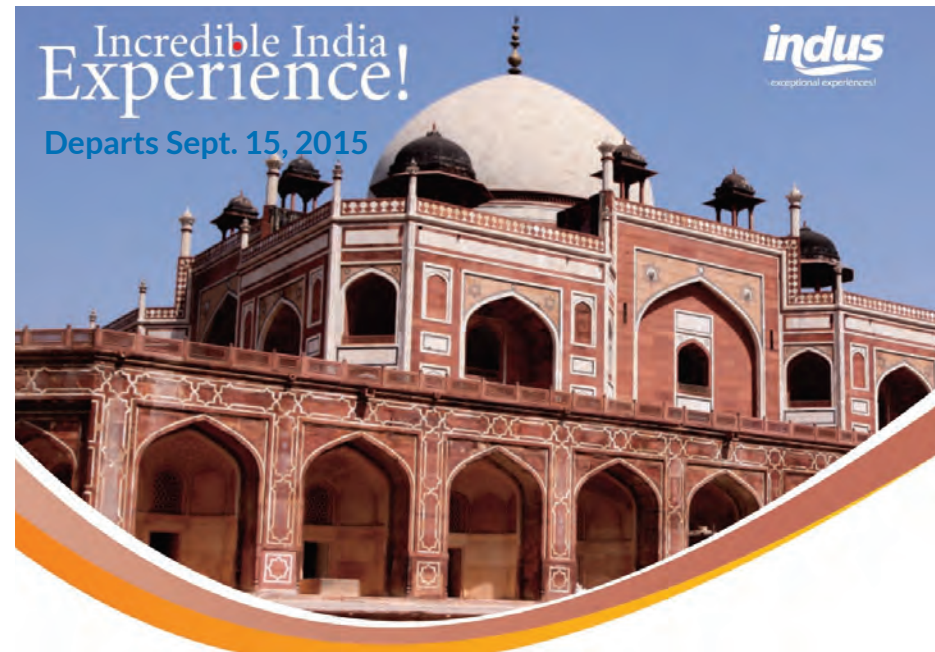
