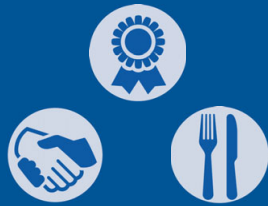

Good Samaritan Medical Center Hosted Bridgewater Raynham Robotics Club

"Students from the FIRST TJ2 Team 88 Robotics Club at Bridgewater Raynham Regional High School recently visited Good Samaritan Medical Center for an opportunity to learn about the da Vinci Robotics Surgical System which is used in the Good Samaritan Medical Center Operating Room by eight robotically trained surgeons. Representatives from Intuitive, the creators of the da Vinci

System, brought a traveling robot to the hospital to allow the 23 students a hands-on experience and to learn about the mechanics and evolution of this particular surgical instrument. Vikas Merchia, MD, Uro-Gynecologist, Good Samaritan Medical Center, spoke to the group about how robotics has changed his approach to surgery before offering a demonstration. Each student was given the opportunity to have their performance on the robot simulation

scored with seven members of the team scoring 100%."
