Good Sam Hosts Brockton Partnership Meeting



Good Samaritan Medical Center President, Harry Bane, welcomed many business leaders to the Joseph Moakley Conference Room for a meeting to discuss topics of economic importance to Brockton and the Metro South region. Among the topics discussed, were the more than a dozen anticipated construction projects within Brockton to break ground within the next ten months. 




