# **Brockton City Council To Set Biz Tax Rate for 2020**

In a recent Enterprise News Story, the following was reported..."The City Council is expected to finalize the tax rate for fiscal 2020 at a special meeting scheduled for Monday, (December 2, 2019) at 6:30 p.m. in Council Chambers at City Hall.

John O'Donnell, chairman of the Board of Assessors, is expected to make a presentation on the city's tax base and the effects of altering the shift percentage in the city's split tax rate for residential and business properties. If the City Council stands pat on the 173 percent shift, commercial property owners will face an average tax bill increase of \$342.72, based on a potential \$30.60 tax rate (per \$1,000 of property value). However, if the City Council makes a move to favor residential property owners even more, increasing to the maximum state-allowed 175 percent shift, the commercial tax rate could rise to \$30.95, resulting in an average bill increase of \$521 for commercial property owners.

The limit on the percentage shift in favor of residential property owners can be raised to a maximum of 175 percent under state law, which could slightly ease the burden facing homeowners, but increasing the shift would also hurt the interests of local business owners, who would face a larger commercial/industrial tax rate and bigger tax bills in that scenario.

Businesses and the Metro South Chamber of Commerce have long warned City Council about placing too much of a burden on Brockton commercial and industrial property owners, noting that other communities have much more attractive commercial tax rates. While Brockton's commercial tax rate for fiscal 2019 was \$31.67, it was \$22.20 in nearby Braintree, \$19.05 in Weymouth and \$25.18 in Quincy.

At a single tax rate, which could hypothetically be set this year at \$17.69 to meet the fiscal 2020 tax levy, the single family homeowners in Brockton would face an average bill increase of \$946, while commercial property owners would get a \$8,520 break.





Massasoit Community College will lease space on the new building's


