


Massasoit Workshops Held Downtown at Chamber

UMassD Completes Economic Outlook Survey





The UMass Dartmouth Center for Marketing Research (UMD CMR) recently completed an Economic Outlook Survey of businesses within the Metro South Region. The Center, led by Dr. Nora Barnes, conducted simple random surveying of business owners and operators. Questions focused on both current and future priorities, expenditures, and trends in business and the economy

from the responders' perspective. 71% of businesses state that the Metro South region is a great place to operate a business based upon the central location. 43% of businesses reported that their business condition has improved. In the next six months, 37% of businesses are expecting increases in revenue. 66% of businesses use Facebook as a social media tool to promote their business, making Facebook the most popular social media tool used.

The findings were presented to the Chamber during a Client Dinner that Chamber CEO Chris Cooney and Program Director Lexi Reinertson

attended at UMass Dartmouth. Lexi was a student researcher and came to the Metro South Chamber from UMass Dartmouth, herself working with Dr. Nora Barnes on similar student operated surveys through the Center for Marketing Research.


