
#### Brockton Business Assistance Program, Still Accepting Applications

## Lower Risk Massachusetts Communities Entering Step 2 of Phase 3 - Effective October 5th, 2020



The Baker-Polito Administration announced that effective Monday, October 5th, lower risk communities will be permitted to move into Step II of Phase III of the Commonwealth's reopening plan. All other communities will remain in Phase III, Step I. Governor Charlie Baker also issued a revised gatherings order. #### REOPENING: PHASE 3, STEP 1 & 2 - VIGILANT

Lower risk communities are defined as cities and towns that have not been a "red" community in any of the last three weekly Department of Public Health (DPH) weekly reports.

Effective October 5, a limited number of sectors will be eligible to reopen, with restrictions, in Step II of Phase III for lower risk communities only:

- Indoor performance venues will be permitted to open with 50% capacity with a maximum of 250 people.
  - Outdoor performance venue capacity will increase to 50% with a of 250 people.
- For arcades and indoor and outdoor recreation businesses, additional Step II activities like trampolines, obstacle courses, roller rinks and laser tag will also be permitted to open and capacity will increase to 50%.
  - Fitting rooms will be permitted to open in all types of retail stores.
- Gyms, museums, libraries and driving and flight schools will also be permitted to increase their capacity to 50%.

#### **Revised Gatherings Order:**

- The limit for indoor gatherings remains at a maximum of 25 people for all communities.
- Outdoor gatherings at private residences and in private backyards will remain at a maximum of 50 people for all communities.
- Outdoor gatherings at event venues and in public settings will have a limit of 50 people in Step I communities, and a limit of 100 people in lower risk, Step II communities.

#### **Sector Specific Protocol Updated:**

Businesses and sectors are subject to compliance with all mandatory safety standards. As always, businesses should consult sector-specific protocols and the When Can My Business Reopen? pages at www.mass.gov/reopening.

#### **RESTAURANTS**

Outdoor dining extended until 60 days after the expiration of the state of emergency. Municipalities can opt for date limitations.

- ALL: Remove 24 hr required closure for cleaning, align language with other guidance (i.e. direct to follow latest CDC guidance).
- STEP 2: For performances at restaurants, allow wind/brass instruments but no singing indoors (aligns with indoor performance venues).

## INDOOR & OUTDOOR THEATERS, CONCERT HALLS, AND SIMILAR PERFORMANCE VENUES

- ALL: Staff and performers don't count towards capacity limit. Movie theater increases to 50% capacity per theater and concessions open
- STEP 2: Indoor performance venues open (50% capacity; max 250 people) Outdoor performance venue capacity increases to 50% with a max of 250 people.

#### INDOOR AND OUTDOOR EVENTS

- ALL: Staff and caterers don't count towards capacity limit
- $\bullet$  STEP 2: Allow wind/brass instruments but no singing at indoor events (aligns with indoor performance venues). Advance capacity to 25 persons indoors and 100 persons outdoors.

#### **RETAIL**

- ALL: Open food courts
- STEP 2: Allow fitting rooms to open in all types of stores

#### ARCADES AND INDOOR & OUTDOOR RECREATION BUSINESSES

• STEP 2: Increase capacity to 50%. Open step 2 activities; laser tag, roller rinks, trampolines, obstacle courses.

#### **GOLF**

• ALL: Allow more than 1 rider per cart and allow flag sticks

#### **Extension of Administrative Tax Relief for Local Biz**



On September 15, the Baker-Polito Administration announced extended administrative tax relief measures for small local businesses that have been impacted by the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak, especially in the restaurant and hospitality sectors.

This includes the extension of the deferral of regular sales tax, meals tax, and room occupancy taxes for small businesses due from March 2020 through April 2021, so that they will instead be due in May 2021. Additionally, all penalties and interest that would otherwise apply will be waived.

Businesses that paid less than \$150,000 in regular sales plus meals taxes in the year ending February 29, 2020 will be eligible for relief for sales and meals taxes.

Business that paid less than \$150,000 in room occupancy taxes in the year ending February 29, 2020 will be eligible for relief with respect to room occupancy taxes.

For businesses with meals tax and room occupancy tax obligations that do not otherwise qualify for this relief, late-file and late-pay penalties will be waived during this period.






